



## *Proclamation* *Presented*

### **In Recognition of the Click It or Ticket Campaign**

**WHEREAS**, in an effort to save more lives on Hawai'i's roadways, Hawai'i will be participating in the important campaign to remind all motor vehicle occupants to always buckle up; and

**WHEREAS**, research shows that using seat belts and child safety seats is still the single most effective way to reduce injuries and save lives in motor vehicle crashes; and

**WHEREAS**, Hawai'i's new universal seat belt law will further reduce fatalities and injuries for all occupants in motor vehicle crashes; and

**WHEREAS**, Hawai'i State Department of Transportation; the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration, Hawai'i Police Department; Honolulu Police Department; Kaua'i Police Department; Maui Police Department; Federal Highway Administration; AAA Hawai'i; The Queen's Medical Center; and Kapi'olani Medical Center for Women and Children are dedicated to promoting and encouraging the use of seat belts and child safety seats; and

**WHEREAS**, in an effort to increase awareness of Hawai'i's seat belt law, the Hawai'i State Department of Transportation, in partnership with the organizations mentioned above, will kick off the annual Click It or Ticket campaign, which will run from May 20 to June 2, 2013. The high visibility media, education and enforcement campaign seeks to encourage seat belt and child restraint use for all motor vehicle occupants in Hawai'i;

**NOW, THEREFORE, I, NEIL ABERCROMBIE, Governor, and I, SHAN S. TSUTSUI, Lieutenant Governor** of the State of Hawai'i, do hereby proclaim May 20, 2013, as

in Hawai'i to launch this highly effective, coordinated education and enforcement campaign, and remind the people of the Aloha State to always buckle up, day and night, year round, to reduce injuries and save lives on our roads and highways.
