PROCLAMATION

By the authority vested in me as Governor by the Constitution and laws of the State of Hawaii, in order to prevent the danger of disaster damages, losses, and suffering, and to protect the health, safety, and welfare of the people, I, NEIL ABERCROMBIE, Governor of the State of Hawaii, hereby determine, designate and proclaim as follows:

WHEREAS, the soil foundation adjacent to the section of Kaumualii Highway in the Kekaha area on the southwest shore of the island of Kauai has sustained significant erosion damage caused by waves; and

WHEREAS, from July 16 to 19, 2012 waves eroded approximately fifteen feet of the shoulder of Kaumualii Highway in the Kekaha area; and

WHEREAS, the continual wave action against this section of Kaumualii Highway will undermine the highway pavement and the sewer force main running beneath the highway necessitating its immediate repair and reconstruction to prevent its imminent collapse; and

WHEREAS, this section of Kaumualii Highway is a two-lane highway and is the only route which provides transportation to the west end of the island of Kauai, the County of Kauai landfill, the wastewater treatment plant, and the Pacific Missile Range Facility; and

WHEREAS, the closure of a section of Kaumualii Highway for an extended period of time thereby isolating the residents, visitors and businesses in west Kauai could endanger the health, safety, and welfare of the people, and the economy of the State; and

WHEREAS, losing access to the County of Kauai landfill and the wastewater treatment plant will endanger the health, safety, and welfare of the people, and the economy of the County of Kauai; and

WHEREAS, the potential loss of the sewer force main in the highway will also endanger the health, safety, and welfare of the people, and the economy of the County of Kauai; and

WHEREAS, the environmental permitting, design and construction of the repairs to this highway is expected to take more than a year to complete; and

WHEREAS, the damage, losses, and suffering potentially attributable to the continual erosion and imminent closure of this section of Kaumualii Highway are of such nature as to warrant rehabilitative assistance from the State; and

WHEREAS, prompt, expeditious action is necessary to deal with the emergency roadway repairs to assure the safety of the public; and

WHEREAS, due to the inherent threat to public safety, immediate actions must be taken to conduct emergency roadway repairs; and

WHEREAS, I find that these state of affairs and circumstances are of such a grave nature as to affect the health and safety of the public and that these circumstances require the invocation of provisions of Chapter 128, Hawai'i Revised Statutes, that are effective only during a period of civil defense emergency; and

WHEREAS, the Legislature of the State of Hawai'i has appropriated from the general revenues of the State, monies as may be necessary for expenditure by or under the direction of the Governor for the immediate relief of the conditions created by the emergency; and

WHEREAS, in expending such monies, the Governor may allot any portion to any agency, office, or employee, federal, state, or county, for the most expeditious and efficient relief of the conditions created by the emergency; and

WHEREAS, section 127-10, Hawai'i Revised Statutes, provides that when sections 127-1 to 127-9, Hawai'i Revised Statutes, are not in effect, the Governor may exercise any and all powers contained in chapter 128, Hawai'i Revised Statutes, in order to provide other disaster

relief and that all provisions of the law provided in chapter 128, Hawai'i Revised Statutes, during such period are made applicable to other disaster relief, including without limitation, provisions making or authorizing appropriations or expenditures; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Act 35, Regular Session Laws of Hawai'i 1961, sections 127-1 to 127-9, Hawai'i Revised Statutes, have been indefinitely suspended and are not in effect, the provisions of chapter 128, Hawai'i Revised Statutes, are applicable to other disaster relief; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to section 127-10, Hawai'i Revised Statutes, other disaster relief includes, but is not limited to, the preparation for and the carrying out of all functions, other than functions for which military forces are primarily responsible, to minimize and repair injury and damage resulting from disasters caused by fire, flood, tidal wave, volcanic eruption, earthquake, or other natural causes and major disasters caused by acts of man, including massive oil spills, nuclear accidents, airplane crashes and civil disturbances; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to section 128-8(4), Hawai'i Revised Statutes, the Governor is authorized to suspend any law which impedes or tends to impede or is detrimental to the expeditious and efficient execution of, or conflicts with, disaster relief or other emergency functions; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to section 128-9(8), Hawai'i Revised Statutes, the Governor is further authorized to relieve hardship and inequities or obstructions to the public health, safety, and welfare found by the Governor to exist in the laws and to result from the operation of federal programs or measures taken under chapter 128, by suspending laws, in whole or in part, or by alleviating the provisions of laws on such terms and conditions as the Governor may impose; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to section 128-10(10), Hawai'i Revised Statutes, the Governor may suspend chapter 103D and sections 103-50, 103-53, 103-55, 105-1 to 105-10, and 464-4, Hawai'i Revised Statutes, and I find that these provisions, in whole or in part, impede or tend to impede the expeditious discharge of emergency disaster relief functions for this occurrence and that compliance therewith is impracticable due to existing conditions; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to section 128-10(5), Hawai‘i Revised Statutes, the Governor is further authorized to order and direct government agencies, officers, and employees, state or local, to take such action and employ such measures for law enforcement, medical, health, fire fighting, traffic control, warnings and signals, engineering, rescue, construction, emergency housing, and other welfare, hospitalization, transportation, water supply, public information, training, and other civil defense and emergency functions as may be necessary, and utilize the services, materials, and facilities of the agencies and officers; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to section 128-10(6), Hawai‘i Revised Statutes, the Governor is further authorized to take possession of, use, manage, control, and reallocate any public property, state or county, real or personal, required by the Governor for the purposes of this chapter, including, without limitation, airports, parks, playgrounds, and schools, and other public buildings; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to section 128-10(15), Hawai‘i Revised Statutes, the Governor may take any and all steps necessary or appropriate to carry out the purposes of chapter 128 and to provide for civil defense and other emergency functions.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, NEIL ABERCROMBIE, Governor of the State of Hawai‘i, hereby determine that a danger or threat of disaster contemplated by chapters 127 and 128, Hawai‘i Revised Statutes, currently exists within the Kekaha area of the County of Kauai, State of Hawai‘i; and

I. Proclamation of disaster. Do hereby proclaim this area to be a disaster area for the purpose of authorizing the expenditure of State monies as appropriated for the speedy and efficient measures to avoid damages, losses, and suffering that will result with the failure of the highway by designing, repairing and reconstructing stabilization measures beneath the pavement of the Kaumualii Highway in the Kekaha area; and

II. Exercise of emergency relief powers. Do hereby declare that all preconditions for exercising the powers and authority granted to me under sections 127-11, 128-8(4), and 128-10(10), Hawai‘i Revised Statutes, have been found and satisfied, and that I hereby exercise such powers and authority in relation to this disaster; and


III. Implementation of specific measures. In order to provide expeditious and efficient performance, execution, and implementation of measures to avert the danger or threat of disaster and in accordance with sections 128-8(4), 128-9(8), and 128-10(10), Hawai‘i Revised Statutes, do I hereby suspend, as allowed by federal law, the following statutes to the extent necessary to reduce the danger of the failure of the highway pavement and embankment, and to repair and reconstruct, with any necessary improvements and mitigation efforts, Kaumualii Highway in order to keep it open for use in the Kekaha area of the County of Kauai, State of Hawai‘i:

1. Chapter 6E, **historic preservation.**
2. Section 37-41, **appropriations to revert to state treasury.**
3. Section 37-74(d), **program execution.**
4. Section 40-66, **appropriations lapse.**
5. Chapter 46, **county organization and administration.**
6. Section 103-2, **general fund.**
7. Section 103-53, **contracts with the State or counties; tax clearances, assignments.**
8. Chapter 103D, **procurement code.**
9. Chapter 174C, **state water code.**
10. Chapter 180, **soil and water conservation districts.**
11. Chapter 180C, **soil erosion and sediment control.**
12. Chapter 183, **forest reserves, water development, zoning.**
13. Chapter 183C, **conservation district.**
14. Chapter 183D, **wildlife.**
15. Chapter 195D, **conservation of aquatic life, wildlife, and land plants.**
16. Chapter 198D, **Hawaii statewide trail and access system.**
17. Chapter 205, **land use commission.**
18. Chapter 205A, **coastal zone management.**

19. Section 209-9, **rental or sale of essential commodities during a state disaster; prohibition against price increases.**

IV. Pursuant to and in accordance with section 128-10(5), Hawai'i Revised Statutes, hereby direct, in order to provide emergency disaster relief, all state agencies and officers to cooperate with and extend their services, materials, and facilities as may be required to assist in all efforts to eliminate or significantly reduce the potential danger of the failure of Kaumualii Highway, and to keep the highway open for use through the Kekaha area of the County of Kauai.
