



Proclamation Presented

In Recognition of School Psychology Week in Hawai'i

WHEREAS, the Hawai'i Association of School Psychologist Association reminds us that all children and youth learn best when they are healthy and receive an education that meets their individual needs, including mental health; and

WHEREAS, the Hawai'i Association of School Psychologist Association raises awareness that learning and development are directly linked to the mental health of children and that a supportive learning environment is an optimal place to promote such health; and

WHEREAS, the Hawai'i Association of School Psychologist Association advises that sound psychological principles are critical to proper instruction, learning, social and emotional development, and provides support for a culturally diverse student population; and

WHEREAS, the Hawai'i Association of School Psychologist Association recommends school psychologists be trained to deliver mental health services and academic support that lowers barriers to learning and facilitates collaboration that helps parents and educators identify and reduce risk factors, promote protective factors, create safe schools, and utilize community resources; and

WHEREAS, the Hawai'i Association of School Psychologist Association educates the public on the need for school psychologists who are trained to assess learning difficulties, utilize data-based decision making, implement proven prevention and intervention strategies, evaluate outcomes, and improve accountability; and

WHEREAS, The Hawai'i Association of School Psychologist Association acknowledges the vital role school psychologists play in the personal and academic development Hawai'i's children;

NOW, THEREFORE I, NEIL ABERCROMBIE, Governor, and I, BRIAN SCHATZ, Lieutenant Governor of the State of Hawai'i, do hereby proclaim November 11, 2012, through November 18, 2012, as
