**SECOND SUPPLEMENTARY PROCLAMATION**

By the authority vested in me as Governor by the Constitution and laws of the State of Hawaii, in order to provide relief for disaster damages, losses, and suffering, and to protect the health, safety, and welfare of the people, I, NEIL ABERCROMBIE, Governor of the State of Hawaii, hereby determine, designate and proclaim as follows:

**WHEREAS**, pursuant to section 2 of Act 111, Session Laws of Hawaii 2014, emergency powers are conferred on the Governor of the State of Hawaii to deal with disasters or emergencies, to maintain the strength, resources, and economic life of the community, and to protect the public health, safety, and welfare; and

**WHEREAS**, it has become necessary to supplement my Proclamation of September 5, 2014, and my Supplementary Proclamation of September 22, 2014, relating to the advancing lava flow which continues to advance thereby endangering communities in the Puna District of the county of Hawaii, State of Hawaii, in order to provide additional assistance; and

**WHEREAS**, based upon information from the Hawaii Volcano Observatory, United States Geological Survey, the advancing lava flow is anticipated to cross Highway 130 and is expected to pass through Pahoia as it continues advancing to the ocean; and

**WHEREAS**, the path of the lava flow is expected to isolate a significant segment of the community from vital first-responder services thereby creating a specific need to establish alternative police, fire, emergency management, or other government facilities or sites in order to provide vital services to the public in the impacted area within the Puna District; and

**WHEREAS**, the Pahoia Recycling & Transfer Station remains in the projected path of the lava flow and will need to be closed in the very near future; and

**WHEREAS**, the Pahoia Recycling & Transfer Station is the primary solid waste transfer station in lower Puna, and once cut off by the lava flow it is estimated that approximately 8,000 residents will be in need of an alternative site for the disposal of rubbish and recycling; and

**WHEREAS**, the lack of an alternative solid waste transfer station will adversely impact the health and safety of the community; and

**WHEREAS**, there is a specific need to establish an alternative solid waste transfer station site, and alternative police, fire, emergency management or other government facilities or sites in order to provide vital services to the public in the Puna District.


**NOW, THEREFORE**, I, NEIL ABERCROMBIE, Governor of the State of Hawaii, hereby further determine that an emergency or disaster contemplated by sections 14 and 16 in section 2 of Act 111, Session Laws of Hawaii 2014, continues to threaten the Puna District of the county of Hawaii, State of Hawaii, and do hereby proclaim these areas to be disaster areas for the purpose of authorizing the expenditure of State moneys as appropriated for the speedy and efficient relief of the damages, losses, and suffering resulting from the disaster, and hereby supplement my Proclamation of September 5, 2014, and my Supplementary Proclamation of September 22, 2014, by expanding the scope and application of my Proclamations in order to provide further emergency disaster relief by including the relocation, repair, modification, and/or establishment of county or state government facilities or sites, including, but not limited to those relating to the operations of police, fire, emergency management, public transportation, solid waste management, transitional or emergency housing, or other government functions.

I FURTHER AUTHORIZE AND INVOKE, pursuant to sections 12(b)(8), 13(a)(2), and 13(a)(3) in section 2 of Act 111, Session Laws of Hawaii 2014, in order to provide emergency disaster relief and, to the extent necessary to repair, restore, rebuild, modify, relocate, and/or establish, with any necessary improvements, government facilities, including those relating to the operations of police, fire, emergency management, public transportation, solid waste management, transitional or emergency housing, or other

government functions, I also suspend as allowed by federal law, Chapter 291, Hawaii Revised Statutes, **traffic violations**, to the extent necessary for any state, county, or federal official, employee, agent, contractor, or representative to move any vehicles, construction equipment, farm equipment, mobile equipment, or other types of vehicles, equipment, or things not normally licensed for operation or travel on the highways or roadways for the purpose of this emergency or disaster.

I FURTHER DECLARE that all the provisions of my Proclamation of September 5, 2014, and my Supplementary Proclamation of September 22, 2014, shall remain in full force and effect and are hereby included in the provisions of this Second Supplementary Proclamation and the disaster emergency relief period shall continue through March 6, 2015, except for any projects initiated under this emergency in which case the provisions shall continue until project acceptance and any final accounting or payment obligations, whichever is later.
